#### **DRAFTING 101**

##### **CHRISTINE MANN**

Ever wonder how to get started doing draft work with your Berner? Come learn how you and your best friend can enjoy carting. Whether you would like to get some help around the farm, to enter the St. Patrick's Day Parade, or train for a BMDCA Draft Test, we can help. We will discuss equipment, training techniques and conditioning. Above all else, drafting is about teamwork and having fun! This is a demonstration class. No dogs are allowed in the room so we might move outside for practical draft demonstrations as the weather allows.

*Christine* saw her first Bernese Mountain Dog in 1974 but it was not until the late 80s that she was able to have a Bernese of her own. CH Alpine Joy's Deerpark Sgt Harpo CD DD HIC TT CGC revealed the wonderful world of Bernese to Christine while becoming one of the first BMDCA Versatility Dogs. Nearly thirty years later, she successfully trains and handles her own dogs in conformation, draft, obedience and therapy work creating seven generations of BMDCA Versatility Dogs and Pet Partner Animal Assisted therapy Dogs. Supporting her deep commitment to the Bernese, Christine became a draft judge in 1993 and a licensed AKC conformation judge in 2009. Breeding occasionally, she has bred Bernese under the Blue Moon kennel name since 1994.

#### **ANIMAL COMMUNICATION**

##### **POLLY KLEIN**

Animal communication is the process of talking directly to your animals through thought. Animal communication is wonderful for gaining insight into problem behaviors because solutions are much more effective when your animal's perspective is taken into account. Communication sessions are very useful for gauging how much pain your animal is feeling. It also helps you to determine when your companion animal may want your assistance to leave their body at the end of their life. During private intuitive sessions, Polly receives pictures, dialogue, body sensations and emotions from your animal. She is also able to relay messages back to your animal using these same modalities. Sessions can be done either in person or remotely by providing a picture of your animal. \* She will be available for private sessions after the class. **BEHAVIOR ADJUSTMENT TRAINING (BAT) FOR REACTIVE/FEARFUL/  
AGGRESSIVE DOGS  
LISBETH PLANT**

Introduction to behaviour modification in general, and the BAT-protocol in particular. We will discuss why dogs are reactive and introduce the basics of classical and operant conditioning in general, along with the principles of functional rewards as used in the BAT-protocol. We will then move outdoors to practice the BAT-protocol using non-reactive dogs, for which we will need THREE teams of pre-screened, marginally reactive or young and socially excitable dogs for demo and practice. Demo dogs will be considered on a first-come-first-served basis, but screened for suitability based on a detailed behavior questionnaire. ## **THE SCOOP ON POOP**

### **DIARRHEA AND OTHER GASTROINTESTINAL ISSUES**

#### **JOERG STEINER DVM**

In this session we will explore the many reasons why a dog could be having diarrhea. We will talk about causes of diarrhea that are within the gastrointestinal tract, but also those that are due to diseases outside the GI tract. We will talk about diagnostic tests that can be used to find the underlying cause of diarrhea. Finally, we will also talk about the management of diarrhea, including the use of diets, probiotics, and others.

*Dr. Joerg Steiner* received his Dr. of Veterinary Medicine degree from the Ludwig-Maximilians University of Munich, Germany in 1992. He did an internship in small animal medicine and

surgery at the University of Pennsylvania from 1992 to 1993 and a residency in small animal internal medicine at Purdue University from 1993 to 1996. In 1996 he achieved board certification with the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and the European College of Veterinary Internal Medicine. In 2000 Dr. Steiner received a PhD from Texas A&M University for his work on canine digestive lipases and their use for the diagnosis of gastrointestinal disorders in the dog. In 2012 he was recognized as a Fellow of the American Gastroenterology Association. He currently serves as Professor with the Department of Small Animal Medicine and Surgery and the Department of Veterinary Pathobiology at Texas A&M University. In 2016 Dr. Steiner was named the Dr. Mark Morris Chair in Small Animal Gastroenterology and Nutrition. He also serves as Director of the Gastrointestinal Laboratory at Texas A&M University and is involved in a wide variety of research in small animal gastroenterology. He has authored or co-authored more than 230 peer-reviewed articles, 80 book chapters, and 350 research abstracts.

## **TUESDAY APRIL 25, 9 -11 AM**

### **SIEGER EVALUATIONS MARY ALICE ESCHWEILER**

Mary Alice, a respected and experienced breeder and judge of Bernese, has offered to evaluate your Berner in the European manner. Mary Alice will closely observe and evaluate over 30 different conformation characteristics while the dog stands in a relaxed, natural pose and then is gaited down and back. She will then give an oral critique of the dog to you and the observing Berner U students. You will also receive a written, signed evaluation of conformation and a Sieger certificate if your dog receives an "Excellent" rating. *Everyone is welcome to come and observe without prior registration.*

*Mary Alice* has owned Bernese Mountain Dogs since 1959, trained and earned a championship with her first Berner and showed the first Berner to earn a Utility Dog title. She has bred eight litters, trained, shown, and enjoyed the sport of conformation, tracking, obedience and drafting. She has served as Board Member and President of BMDCA, on many Specialty Committees, Records Chairman, Judges' Education Chair and member of the Draft Working Committee and Regional Club Council. Currently approved as an AKC judge of Bernese, Junior Showmanship and BMDCA draft tests, Mary Alice appears in the recent educational DVD Breed Panel & Discussion filmed in Seattle, Washington.

### **THE GENETICS OF BEHAVIOR IN DOGS CAROL BEUCHAT PHD**

Many behavioral traits are a combination of genetics and environment, and understanding this can allow you to select for the traits you want more efficiently. We will talk about how the heritability of a trait is determined and how breeders can use this information to improve selection for particular traits. We will also talk about behavior and temperament testing, how these have been used in breeding programs, and how informative they are.

*Carol* is a biologist and photographer with a lifelong interest in animals and especially dogs. She is currently the Scientific Director of the Institute of Canine Biology. She has held faculty positions at Colgate University, University of Arizona, and San Diego State University, and has also been a consultant at Hubbs-Sea World Research Institute. She has studied many kinds of animals in both the lab and field including hummingbirds, African sunbirds and sugarbirds, killer whales, pinnipeds (seals and sea lions), frogs and toads, lizards. She has broad expertise in many fields including physiology, ecology, behavior, evolution, and biochemistry. Her interest in canine genetics grew out of her years of photographing show dogs professionally, when she got to work closely with many breeders and learned that many were alarmed by the increasing incidence of genetic disorders in purebred dogs. Realizing that breeders would need both

education and access to expertise to tackle this problem, she founded ICB as an international consortium of canine and population geneticists. ICB now offers many courses specifically designed for dog owners and breeders and also consults with breed groups and individuals about genetic management strategies to reduce and manage the incidence of genetic disorders in dogs.

## **EXERCISE & ITS EFFECTS ON SURVIVAL & TOLERATION OF CANCER THERAPY** **LISA PARSHLEY DVM**

When recommending a treatment for canine cancer, veterinarians must always consider the benefits as well as the side effects. Ancillary treatments, including nutrition, exercise and palliative care must all be thoughtfully integrated and monitored to achieve the sought for remission. The class will focus on exercise and it's contribution to survival for your Berner.

## **CANINE BODY LANGUAGE** **LISBETH PLANT**

Have you ever wondered what your dog is thinking? Do you perhaps have a dog that is "unpredictable", or sometimes just does things that you don't understand? Or would you simply like to understand more of your dog's language? This presentation includes live-action video clips to illustrate not only different canine communications, but also show the speed at which these things can change. You will learn how to be a better observer of your dog and to improve your understanding of your dog. The presentation is followed by Q&A session.

## **DO MORE WITH YOUR DOG: TRAINING TRICKS TO BUILD RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR CONFORMATION DOG** **MELANIE KOONS**

This class, offered *exclusively* for Juniors (age 9-17), will teach some fundamental positive reinforcement training principles, introduce use of a clicker or marker word for shaping behavior, and help each participant teach several tricks to their dog. There will be 10 working spots for Junior handler/dog teams and unlimited auditing (JR Handler only). Each working participant will need to bring a dog with a flat buckle collar and 4-6 ft leash, portable crate or x-pen for dog to rest

in when not working, and a water dish. A variety of high value training treats, a clicker, and a bait bag will be provided to each team. If your dog has food allergies, you will need to bring your own treats.

*Melanie* has owned a total of five Bernese. She currently has three dogs, ranging in age from 21 months to 9 years old. She started learning to train about seven years ago with her first dog and has taken many classes since then, learning a lot about how to build relationship with her dogs. She has participated in Draft, Obedience, Rally, Agility, and Conformation. She has learned enough to work two of her dogs through to Grand Master Draft Dog awards, has earned multiple titles in Rally, Obedience and Agility with four of her dogs and feels confident about teaching some useful skills to help juniors in the conformation ring or other dog sports.

## **RESPONSIBLE BREEDING BEYOND THE BOX BOBBIE HEFNER & LINDA SEAVER**

Healthy, thriving four-week old puppies are surely the goal and the glory in your whelping box. However before and after that moment, there's a lot to do to become a responsible and ethical Berner breeder. Consider the necessity to understand genetics, breed type, structure and neonatal care which all begin months prior to breeding, the many hours spent educating prospective puppy owners, planning for families to visit, establishing a good relationship with your new owners, learning appropriate small business practices and choosing avenues of life-long stewardship. These, plus getting enough sleep, are all topics we'll cover in this class. Join this discussion where ideals, ethics and reality cross paths.

*Bobbie* has owned and bred Bernese Mountain Dogs under the top winning Swiss Stars kennel name for nearly 30 years (she was obviously only five when she started). Her photos have long been a staple of the National Photo contest, and her litter pictures are always a treat. She travels extensively, and many of us enjoy her vacations vicariously through her breathtaking photos. She works with Wildlife Rehab and Release and does photographs of the birds. She has also been one of the few people invited to a Navaho reservation preserve to do wildlife photography.

*Linda* is most familiar as Berner University co-creator with Andrea Brin. She is the former BMDCA Breeder Education Chair developing both the Breeder Symposium and the Breeder Mentor Program, the recipient of the 2010 Outstanding Service Award, and continues as a BMDCA Breed Steward and ringside mentor for Judge's Education. She has competed with her dogs in conformation, obedience, draft, agility and rally. Between 1983 and 2012, she bred Bernese under the Tschuggen kennel prefix.

## **TUESDAY 3-5 PM**

### **UNDERSTANDING MOVEMENT MARJORIE REHO**

Do you sit ringside wondering how to evaluate good movement versus poor? Do you understand the relationship between movement as viewed and the underlying anatomy that influences what you're seeing? Do you know how to evaluate your own dogs to determine structure and how to improve it in your breeding program? Can you evaluate your litters for structure to determine movement potential? These topics will be discussed in "Understanding Movement". If dogs are volunteered and approved space is identified, we will use them to demonstrate class material. Don't miss this class – it's our most popular year after year.

*Marjorie* has owned Bernese Mountain Dogs and been active in the BMDCA since 1978. Under

the kennel name of “Dallybeck”, she has bred 24 litters, and has produced some of the top dogs in the United States and Canada. At National Specialties, her own dogs, Dallybeck-produced dogs, and offspring of Dallybeck dogs, have won such prestigious awards as High In Trial, Best of Opposite Sex, Winners Dog, Best of Winners, Award of Merit, first in Stud Dog, first in Brood Bitch, both Best and Best of Opposite in Veteran Sweeps with son and dam, and many class placements in obedience disciplines, and conformation, regular and non-regular, puppy through veteran classes; some of these awards won several times over. Many dogs from her breeding have been Versatility Award Winners over the years. She has produced the BMDCA Top Producer, Conformation Dog. Margie’s active interests in the breed focus on the total dog: structure, soundness, type, temperament, working ability and longevity. She became the first recipient of a Dog World Award for Bernese in obedience, and also placed a Tracking Degree on her bitch. In conformation, she has judged Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes classes in Canada, and at the BMDCA National Specialty in Colorado.

## **RESCUE 101 & RESCUE ROUND TABLE**

### **KATHY DEYO**

RESCUE 101, the first hour of this seminar, will be a presentation of how Bernese rescue works on both the regional club level and national level. The discussion will enable you to become more aware of the process and perhaps find a way to participate. We’ll review all aspects of running a Bernese rescue committee: working with shelters, finding evaluators we can trust, identifying strategies for both supporting owners and for removing the dogs, attending to legal concerns, evaluating behavioral issues, finding foster homes, finding volunteer transporters, funding the program, using the web to locate and interview potential families - all with the goal of finding forever homes for dogs in need. Anyone curious about rescue is welcome to come.

The RESCUE ROUND TABLE, the second hour of this seminar, offers an opportunity for BMDCA recognized regional clubs, BARC, and people who individually rescue Bernese to share problems, concerns and solutions. We find that when online friends meet face-to-face it allows us to support each other and create an even stronger network for the next time we need to rescue a Berner. Newcomers are welcome to join us for one or both hours as we always appreciate fresh perspectives.

*Kathy* has been blessed with Bernese since 1986 and has bred five generations of Bernese under the Hapi Mtn kennel name. She joined the BMDCA in 1987, served on the BMDCA board in 2001-2002 and again in 2007-2008, and became the BMDCA National Rescue & Rehome Coordinator in 2001 after helping with several Bernese rescue situations in her area. She currently shows in conformation, teaches obedience, showmanship and agility classes, works with 4-H kids, and just enjoys her dogs including Spam, a 3 year old Staffordshire Bull Terrier. She continues to compete and also performs with the family entertainment group, The Superdogs.

## **AKC BMD STANDARD –THE FINER POINTS**

### **FRAN BROWN & GAIL VOGEL**

“First things first” at Berner U means “Know the Standard”. This seminar will cover the basic information about Bernese using the AKC Standard, as well as many of the finer points that only the experienced eyes of longtime breeders and judges might notice. Fran and Gail will share the presentation given to provisional judges but will elaborate, using a new power point for examples of the details that make a truly spectacular conformation Bernese Mountain Dog.

### **FRAN BROWN**

*Fran* has owned, bred, shown and judged Berners most of her life. Her first Berner was a Sanctuary Woods boy, Ch Delsas Andante v Lancer. She was only able to get him because he was very shy, as many were in those days. In 40 years of having the privilege of knowing their gentle souls and their great desire to connect to their

people, she's seen an improvement in Berner character and temperament. Fran believes Berners to be emotionally sensitive companion animals and therefore advocates owning a very small number of dogs in order to give each one the time and attention they deserve.

She has bred or owned about 20 Champions and judged our National Specialty in Gettysburg in 2005 with an entry of 1042! Over the past several years, Fran has also judged many Supported entries and Regional Specialties. Her further service is through Judges' Education as a ringside mentor. In addition to Bernese, Fran has owned Top Winning and Best In Show Sealyham Terriers since 1980. Licensed for eight Terrier and fifteen Working breeds, she has an excellent eye for a dog that she will share with us.
